New date for free seminar for young writers in October

Port-of-Spain, October 1, 2010: The Allen Prize for Young Writers seminar for teenage writers planned for October 8, 2010, has been pushed back to October 11, 2010. This is the first of three seminars The Allen Prize intends to hold in this school year; others are planned for the following terms for South/Central and Tobago schools. There will be no charge to participants but registration will be done on a first come, first served basis, as spaces are limited.

The Allen Prize was founded in 2009 to give prizes, training and publication to writers aged 12-19 years. On September 1, 2010, it opened its inaugural prize competition in the genres of poetry, fiction, creative non-fiction and drama. Part of the organisation's mandate is to provide free training to youths who are interested in writing, with a view to increasing the appeal of writing as a profession. The organisation and its programmes have been endorsed by the Ministry of Education.

"We opted to change the date to allow the widest possible participation," said Allen Prize founder and chairman Lisa Allen-Agostini.
